The youth will also have the opportunity to meet with an Employment Specialist once a week to do self-discovery and look at part time job opportunities that they might be interested in exploring.

We are very excited to be part of this research project with youth to better prepare them in their employment goals. We have gotten great feedback from our cohorts and families from 2020 and 2021. The youth really enjoyed the social aspect of connecting with others over virtual platform while discussing work related topics with their peers and gaining confidence in their communication and teamwork skills.
