Keeping Kids Safe Online and In School

We welcome the <u>BC Government's announcement last month</u> aimed at keeping kids and young adults safe from online threats, restrict the use of cellphones in schools and hold social media companies accountable.

The Delta School District already has an administrative procedure in place to cover the use of Personal Communication Devices (Admin Procedure 145) that provides guidance for schools and educators. In the coming months, the district expects to receive more detailed guidelines from the government regarding the restriction of students' cellphone use in schools. Once that information is received, the district will look at making any necessary changes for implementation at the start of the new school year in September.

Core Competency Self-Assessment

Next week students and teachers will engaged in review and/or discussion on the Core Competencies that are a part of the curriculum. The purpose of these discussions is to get students reflecting on how the core competencies are present in their daily lives.

The Core Competencies are sets of intellectual, personal, and social and emotional proficiencies that all students need in order to engage in deep, lifelong learning. They move from demonstrating competence in relatively simple and highly supported situations, to demonstrating independence in more complex and varied contexts. Competency development does not end with school graduation but continues in personal, social, educational, and workplace contexts (Core Competencies - Ministry of Education).

On March 12th, students will complete their second self-reflection on their understanding and application of the core competencies. Students will receive an email with their response and their self-assessment is viewable in Google Classroom. The self-assessment will be completed one more time in June.

Students took this year's game with some late 3 pointers for the win. Thank you to all participants as well as our student fans for cheering on both staff and students.


