(grades 10 - 12)

Average student graduates with 96 - 100 credits
(some up to 120)

each course = 4 credits... so = 20 courses minimum


English 10

- Explores English First Peoples literature

Math 10 Choices

Foundations & Pre-Calculus Math 10

- Appropriate for all post-secondary options
- Leads to Foundations 11/12 or Pre-calculus 11/12

Workplace Math 10

- Entry into majority of trades and direct entry to the workforce

Physical Health Education 10 Options

PHE 10

- Emphasis on active participation in variety of games, sports, and fitness activities
- Learning about well-being (i.e. physical, mental, social-emotional)

PHE 9/10 Leadership

- Focus on becoming leaders through use of recreation and classwork
- ½ PHE and ½ Leadership course
- Service hours mandatory
- Must apply on basis of leadership (i.e. skills, attitude, participation)

Physical Health Education 10 Options

Volleyball & Fitness Concepts (10-12)

- On-court & physical training
- Counts as your PHE 10 credit
- For recreational and competitive volleyball players

Basketball & Fitness Concepts (10-12)

- On-court & physical training
- Focuses on developing basketball knowledge, skills, and abilities
- Counts as your PHE 10 credit
- For recreational and competitive basketball players

Do I Need a 2nd Language?

You do *NOT* need a 2nd language to graduate OR to enter UBC or SFU effective 2026.



Things to consider about a 2nd language:

- Post-secondary institutions may still consider a language as a course used to calculate GPA
- Opens doors to career opportunities!

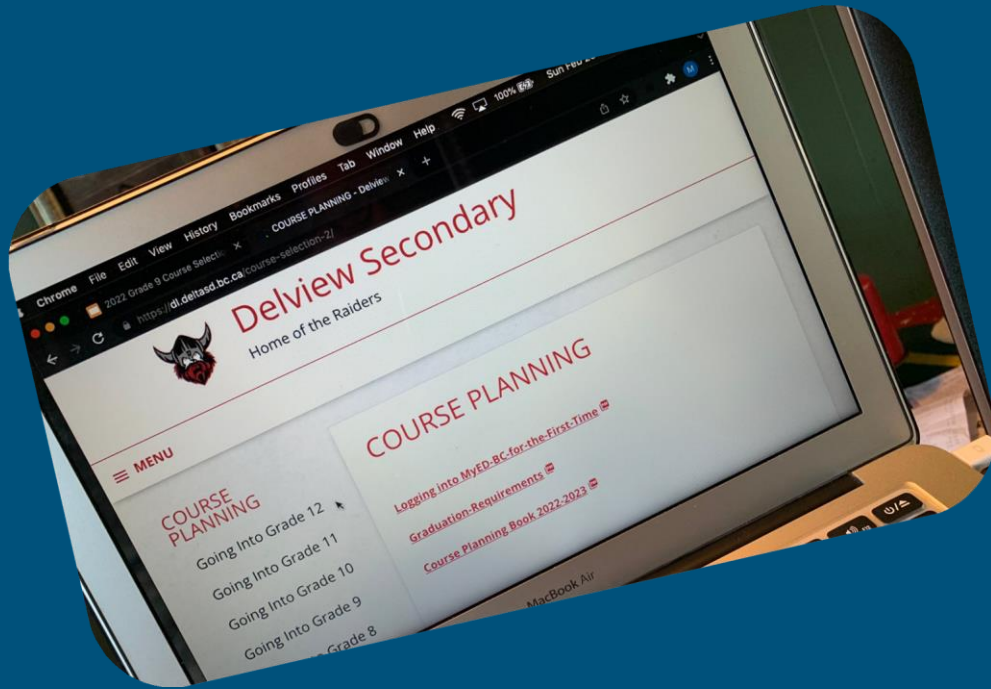
