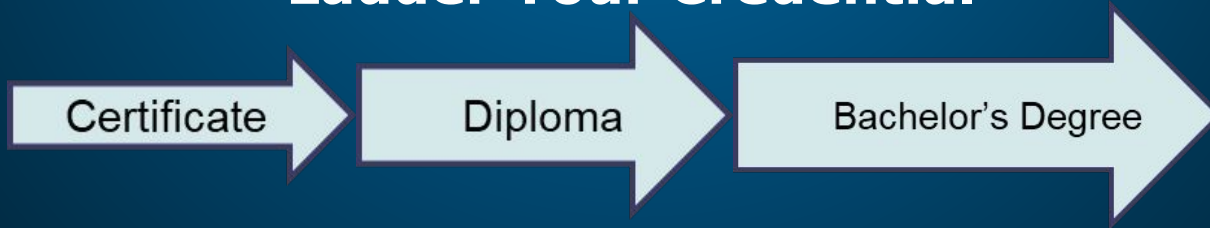

Apprenticeship Programs for High School Students



Working in a Trade

Hired as an Apprentice

- Hired as an apprentice
- Obtain high school courses (up to 4 courses total)
- This can be for any red seal trade. The supervisor must be a certified journeyman



Training in a Trade

Post Secondary Schooling

- If accepted, the school district will pay the tuition
- Applications due before spring break
- For students going into grades 11 or 12 the following school year



Work Experience

- Students in Grades 11-12 (sign up in Grade 10) **Minimum 16 years of age**
- 90 hours of volunteer work in an area of interest
- Gain real-world experience and employability skills
- Receive up to 4-8 graduation credits
- Students sign up at course planning time

General Admission requirements C or C+ in English 12

- Some courses and programs (math, sciences, business) will require further prerequisites but students can upgrade
- Limited Enrolment Programs (Nursing, Engineering Certificate, **Specialized Diploma Programs**) have further **pre-requisites in math & sciences**

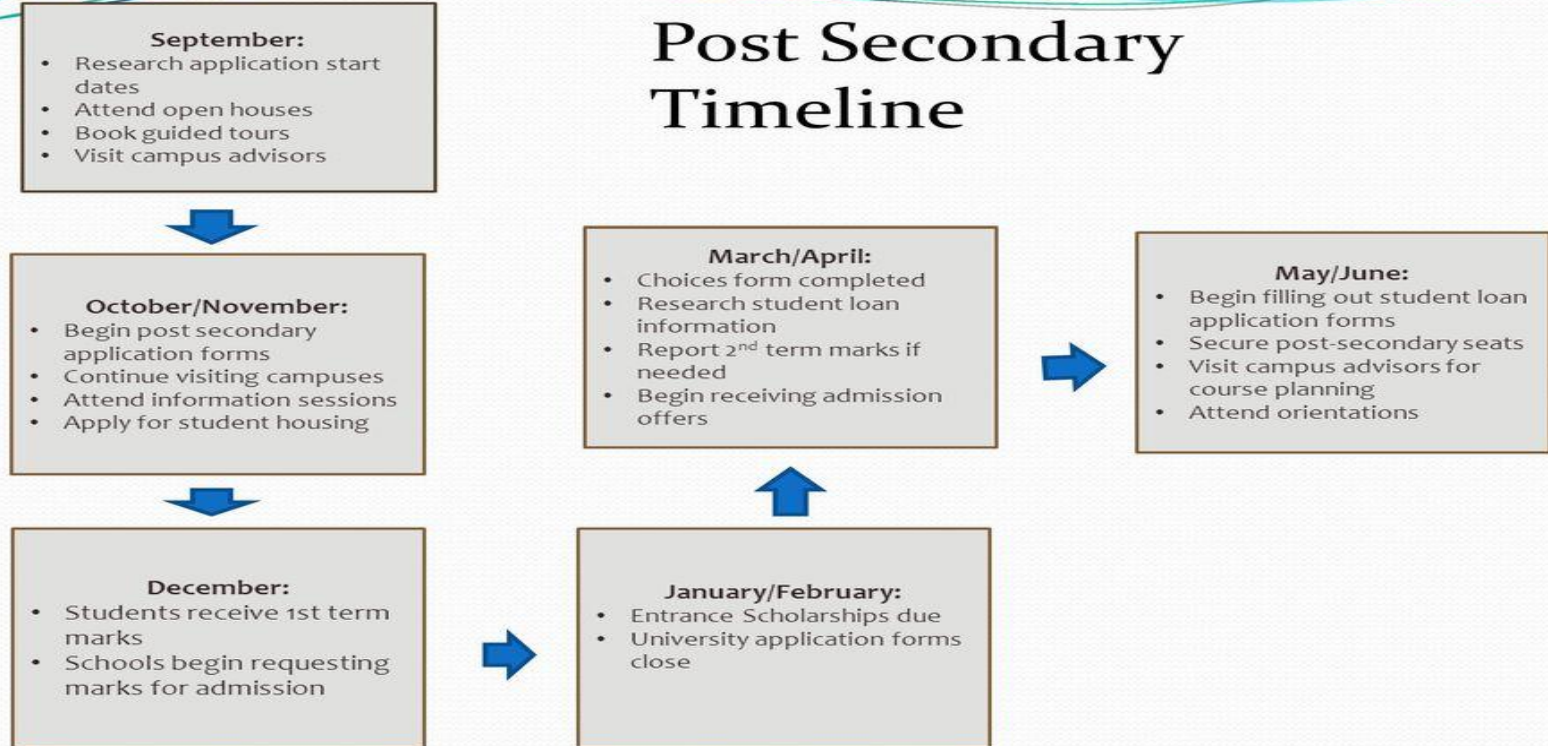
