Semestered school with a hybrid in Grade 8 (Linear PHE and French 8)

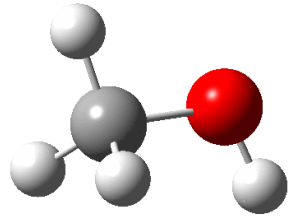
